

The Society's district for the purpose of Local classes shall comprise those parishes any part of which lies within a seven mile radius of either Longridge or Goosnargh Parish Churches.

All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.

All stock and produce must be on the show ground on the day of the show, in the position assigned to them by 9:30am and remain there until 4:00pm.

All prize winners in the large livestock classes must take part in the grand parade of prize winners, or the prizes withheld.

Labels and numbers will be available at the Secretary's Office on the show ground, and must be obtained from there by the exhibitor or his responsible agent.

No numbers for any section will be sent out before show day.

Not more than one person will be allowed to enter the show ground with each animal, except in the case of bulls over one year old, two people will be allowed admission.

All bulls over one year old must be secured by a ring in the nose and a chain or staff, and homed cattle must be shown in a halter.

The Society, through its council and agents will exercise all reasonable care for the safety of the exhibits, but the Society does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage which may be sustained by the exhibitor or any damage sustained by any third part, whether arising from accident or through any act of omission of the Society, its council, officers, agents or servants or other persons, or from any other cause. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor will hold the Society and the council blameless, and will indemnify them against any proceedings compensation, costs, damages arising out of or in connection with any such claim, loss, accident or damage, and entries are accepted on this understanding only.

Therefore all exhibitors must carry adequate third party liability insurance.

The |Society will endeavour to make provision to enable exhibitors to comply with any requirements of DEFRA or other competent authority, but the compliance with such requirements the responsibility of the exhibitor, who shall provide all necessary equipment and utensils for the purpose.

The decision of the judge or referee shall in all cases be accepted as final and conclusive, except when fraud, misrepresentation or breach of regulation is discovered, and any exhibitor who shall be disqualified for any such reason, shall be liable to forfeit any prize or other award given to them at the show.

The Society reserves to itself the right to withhold any prize or prizes when the judge reports there is not sufficient merit, not with standing that there may be several competitors.

If in any class there are not more than three entries, the first prize money may be withheld, but the winning exhibitor shall receive the second prize money with the first prize card and the remaining exhibitors the cards and the money in similar order.

The Society reserves to itself by its council sole right to interpret these rules and regulations affecting the conduct of the show and to arbitrarily settle and determine all or any matter, question or indifferences in regard hereto ,or cancel awards or prizes or reserved numbers and relax conditions as the Society may deem expedient.

All protects and objections must be promptly lodged with the Secretary at their office on the show ground. The objection or protest shall be in writing, and shall be accompanied by a deposit of £10 which may be retained by the Chairman of the Society shall have power to appoint a protest Committee of any number of members of the council (including himself if he so wishes) to deal with the protest forthwith, or may at his discretion, refer the matter to the council of the Society at its next meeting.

All challenge cups and trophies are to be awarded for an annual period unless otherwise stated.

All prize money will be paid out on the show field on the show day only.

Cups and trophies to be engraved by the winners, if they wish.

In the event of an outbreak of disease, all classes will be cancelled and all entry fees will be refunded.

All animals returning home from the show must go into approved isolation premises or observe the six day rule.

All vehicles must be clean when setting out from home and all bio-security rules must be observed.

All animals must be entered by the entry closing date to meet DEFRA rules.

Facilities for Maedi Visna Accredited and Non-accredited sheep will be provided.

All sheep must be correctly tagged according to the regulations in force on the date of the show.
