13	A paper plate farm animal
14	A magic wand made from a stick (max length 30cm)
15	An artwork on the theme of a garden – could be a model, flat art work, or decorated object. Any media (A4)

16	A picture using flower hammer art (A4)

**TITLE : Model of a garden in the spring**, can be made from any media (no pre-made kits). To be presented on a base no larger than 100cm x 70cm.

Entry fee £1. Prize money 1<sup>st</sup> = £6.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> = £4.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> = £2.00

Exhibits must be staged by the exhibitor/school organiser on Friday 4th July 2024 12.30pm – 7pm. Judging takes place at 8.45am to 10am on Show Day. Prizes awarded at 3pm on show day. All artworks should be removed from the marquee by the exhibitor by 5pm on show day. Exhibits on paper should be mounted on card.
